First, he passionately petitioned the Lord for spiritual wisdom and counsel (i.e. "**Teach me.**"). Here we observe that he was fully aware of the limitations of his knowledge and wisdom, and too his inability to handle the dire ordeal that he was confronting.

Too often, this is a key element in our praying that is completely absent, or we actually marginalize and push into the background; but, in essence, it is the essential factor upon which rests all the intervening action of Heaven.

The Lord Jesus directed us to pray to the Father, "Thy will be done." (Matt. 6:1)

Lead Me

Next, the inspired writer showed us that he was fully aware of his limitations and inability to navigate his life through the dire life ordeal that he was confronting. Thus, he pleaded; **"lead me into the land of uprightness."**

This was a simple request to be shown the "**right path**" out; or, the "straight and smooth" path as opposed to that which is "crooked and "rocky."

QUICKEN (REVIVE) ME

Lastly, David petitioned the Court of Heaven to infuse and reinvigorate his soul with a refreshing charge of spiritual energy. Indeed, the Lord is the only source from whom we can obtain true, godly supernatural enablement.

In the grand text of **Psalms 23**, David joyfully affirmed in verse **23a:** "He restoreth my soul." Also, in **Psalms 119:25** he pleaded: "My soul cleaveth unto the dust: quicken thou me according to thy word."
